


Over the past few years, many new businesses have found a home in West Columbia, with more on the way. Business licenses issued by the City of West Columbia in 2021 have outpaced the rate in 2020.

Savage Craft Ale Works, The Hideout in WECO, Gentleman's Quarters Barbershop, Jake's on Meeting, Select Physical Therapy in the Brookland Development, Franks Car Wash, at 1707 Charleston Highway, and D'Alberto, Graham, and Grimsley Law Firm, at 508 Meeting Street are just some of the businesses opened in the past year. Studio 221 Interiors, of Chapin, recently opened its second location on 536 Meeting Street in September 2021.

The Cake House Casa del Pastel opened at 323-B Ninth Street in April 2021. It's a dessert shop and bakery. Debbie Truett is one of the owners and she said the business has been very good. Always Original Bakery opened on Meeting Street in October 2021, with inventory flying out of the cases.

In addition to businesses that have already opened, some are set to open soon. A Murphy USA Gas Station and a Take 5 Car Wash are being built on the property in the Carolina Pottery complex at 2816 Augusta Road, across from Lowe's. Other businesses are planning to open soon. Cucinella's Pizzeria and Italian Ice is coming to Westland Square on Sunset Boulevard. It is expected to open before the end of the year. Garibaldi Plaza, which includes the Garibaldi Restaurant and SuperMarket, is currently under construction on Jarvis Klapman Boulevard and Augusta Road.
